GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF EDUCATION IN CONNECTION WITH THE CURRENT EPIDEMIOLOGICAL STATE AIMING AT A JOINT AND RESPONSIBLE CARE OF EACH OTHER

Recommendations for the organization of classes:

- 1. Students should avoid gatherin before, during and after the class.
- 2. Students should be organized classes in a way that excludes the possibility of grouping people (e.g. time intervals).
- 3. Information, observations, questions, etc. should be communicated to students with use of electronic media.
- 4. Information on the permissible number of people in the room is posted on the door input. Seats should be arranged in such a way that there are between persons, the required distance in each direction was kept.
- 5. When the number of people in the room exceeds the permissible number of people specified on the door, required is covering the mouth and nose by people staying in the room.
- 6. If it is not possible to ensure an appropriate interval during the course students and lecturers are required to cover their mouth and nose.
- 7. At the entrances to buildings, there should be devices for disinfecting hands with an appropriate one information (bilingual) that should be used by everyone entering and leaving person.
- 8. Teaching rooms should be ventilated regularly, also before classes and every hour during classes, if the weather conditions allow it.

Recommendations for teachers:

- 1. Students should be informed of the safety rules in advance.
- 2. At the entrance to the building where the classes are planned, students disinfect their hands, and in selected classes, in particular in classes that require use from devices and equipment owned by the University, at the instruction of the teacher they put on gloves received from the teacher.
- 3. The principle of covering the mouth and nose is valid in the classrooms where classes are held, if it is not possible to keep a safe distance.
- 4. Lecturers should keep their mouth and nose covered when they cannot keep safe distance from students.
- 5. The person conducting the classes should have a full register of attendance (electronic or in a version paper) from each activity, so that if a threat is detected, it can be done quickly identify people who may come into contact with a person infected with SARS-CoV-2.

Recommendations for students:

- 1. At the entrance to the building where the classes are planned, students, participants disinfect hands (alcohol-based preparation, min. 60%), and during selected classes they put on gloves at the instruction of the teacher.
- 2. In the case of classes that require the use of proprietary devices and equipment For college, wearing gloves is essential.
- 3. Students keep the required safe distance while waiting for entry to classes with covered mouth and nose.
- 4. The principle of covering the mouth and nose is also valid in the classrooms where the classes are held when it is not possible to keep a safe distance.
